I received the below from West Coast Shipping re registering a car in Paris, France:

if you are not planning on using the car in France, you do not need to register the car. If your boss is moving to France, he can only drive for 2 weeks

with the license plates. Afterward, he needs to register it. Another option might be issuing a Carnet. If he gets a Carnet, he can stay up to one year with the car in the EU and use his American registration, afterward he needs to ship it back to the US.

I would recommend you to introduce me directly to your boss, so I can explain him this. It is a tricky subject...
