Dear Jeffrey,

We finally received the different quotations for the "home automation" system which need to be included in the different parts of your project.

It took us more time as planned and we are truly sorry about it, but we couldn't have all those details earlier.

The total and final price for the project inspired by Roux-Spitz is 92 000€ Net Price (excl VAT).

It will be made in black pearwood with customized handles, lights and invisible trapdoor for the screen and keyboard.

The size, which will be confirmed, will be around 2.80m x 3m.

A hidden tablet in the depth of the desk on the sofa side could be used as a worktop for your business partner.

The phone and light will have their own space on the right side.

We will prefer the black pearwood instead of the black lacquered wood for his sophisticated and solid side.

If you agree, we will need quick the references of your informatics tools (screen, computer, phones ...) and a 50% deposit.

We need 6 weeks to send you the technical plans and the samples to be approved before the production.

The lead time will be 4 months after agreement.

We can plan the packing in wood boxes to be shipped and if you want we can take care of everything concerning the shipping to New York (papers, customs...).

Concerning the project for Paris the desk in Ebony of Makassar with 4 boxes for your collaborator and the home automation is evaluated at 62 000€ (VAT excluded).

We will manage the order exactly the same way as for the one in New York, which means :

- = 50% deposit
- = Lead-time 3 months ½

We hope we answer to your expectations and we are looking forward to hearing your comments.
