Could turn the coffee table around, which wo=ld bring the chairs in, giving more room - probably best idea so far. =lso helping with the space where the horsehair shelving was. Clearly as I a= writing this I need to move the coffee table around and check scale. I wil= do this either later today or first thing in the morning. I need to get th=s stuff out to Darren

I showed JE the photos and he would like to s=ee more photos of the overall room with the couch against the back wall so h= can get a better sense; photos from the corners, etc, so there is more per=pective of overall room. Maybe we get a shorter couch for that room, c=uld be an option I suppose. They sell the same couch in a 6' version. (the c=rrrent one is 7') Not sure if that would make enough of a difference. <=div>

He also said we can take out the horse hair cabinet, but I know we will=need something there to cover the conduit, etc. I don't know how large it i= or what is looks like? Maybe we could have a box built around it which ope=s that could be painted the same as the walls?

JE said we don't have to worry about covering the shelves in the back o= the room because his back will be to them. He said we don't even have to w=rry about the curtains coming all the way to the shelving on the wall becau=e we won't see that part either when watching a movie. He doesn't seem too c=ncerned with the way it will look when you walk in the room, as long as it m=akes the walls black while watching a movie so there isn't the glare off the=white walls.

16 - Sofa on back wall


15 - Gap between chair and horsehair with sofa on back wall
