Would recommend waiting to see how this all looks before looking at=purchasing other furniture

24, 25, 26, 27, 34 - Sofa on back wall

28, 29 - Items=that need to be enclosed, that were in horsehair shelving

30, 32, 33 - S=owing the space on either side of TV, noting if had a smaller chest could d= 1/2 moon desks!!

36, 38 - I moved the sofa forward, noting gap behind, not enough f=r anything, but giving more room in the corners. This makes coffee tab=e right over the location for the chandelier - which will anchor the room</=iv>

40 - I know it is hard to imagine, sorry about table on bean bag, b=t I need to get the height and as I am typing this I should have used t=e outside tall cafe table to show what I mean - possible tables in eac= corner at the very least could have a c=air or 2. Possible small card tables!!

1 foot would make some difference on the sofa, but would be the wrong s=ale for the coffee table. Could turn the coffee table around, which wo=ld bring the chairs in, giving more room - probably best idea so far. =Iso helping with the space where the horsehair shelving was. Clearly as I a= writing this I need to move the coffee table around and check scale. I wil= do this either later today or first thing in the morning. I need to get th=s stuff out to Darren

Agree about sofa back wall, I will set it up this afternoon and review the scale, to be honest I did not move the coffee table in place because I could not move it - will get some strong bodies to help me with that. Will let you know about the size of furniture etc

Fabric - Black very black, I will also measure up this afternoon and forward

FYI - we do need to review the leather in the library, as one thing we did not address was the other side of the screens ie the big window when closed shows raw wood when you look thru the window - staining would solve the problem - I will forward photos also

very helpful. Personally, I think it makes sense to have the sofa on the back wall with no game table. I showed JE the photos and he would like to see more photos of the overall room with the couch against the back wall so he can get a better sense; photos from the corners, etc, so there is more perspective of overall room. Maybe we get a shorter couch for that room, could be an option I suppose. They sell the same couch in a 6' version. (the current one is 7') Not sure if that would make enough of a difference.

He also said we can take out the horse hair cabinet, but I know we will need something there to cover the conduit, etc. I don't know how large it is or what it looks like? Maybe we could have a box built around it which opens that could be painted the same as the walls?

JE said we don't have to worry about covering the shelves in the back of the room because his back will be to them. He said we don't even have to worry about the curtains coming all the way to the shelving on the wall because we won't see that part either when watching a movie. He doesn't seem too concerned with the way it will look when you walk in the room, as long as it makes the walls black while watching a movie so there isn't the glare off the white walls.

He questioned the blackness of the fabric from the photos, but in person it looks black right? I said it was just the flash from the camera that made it look lighter.

1 - Fabric I am suggesting

2 & 3 - other fabric sample which I do not think will work as well

5 - Back Shelving Wall Great Room - may not need to be addressed with fabric?

7 - Showing corner - fabric would not stop at shelving, but go right into corner -

cut out area

9 - Showing how a rod could go right in front of shelving, sitting on moulding
noting that when curtains were pulled back, you would still see the rod
10, 11 & 13 - Relax room with 2 matching chairs, noting door hits chair
14 - Space between sofa and table on back wall I do not believe we could move
it any closer
12 - Space between side table and horsehair book shelf
16 - Sofa on back wall
15 - Gap between chair and horsehair with sofa on back wall
19 - Gap between chair and wall with sofa on back wall


Please note I think the room looks very good in pictures 10 & 19 - shame about


