They are so different, Christine so warm, loving and giving all of herself to you, always giggling and optimistic about her presently dismal future, yet genuinely concerned for others, especially myself and her siblings, but remains slightly disorganised and vaguely scatter-brain. Isabel, on the other hand, so contained, more masculine, slightly aggressive like most people who live on their own and have no one but themselves to count upon, cool headed but also truly loving and efficiently concerned. It is amazing to have had so many children and yet so different, with basically in common their love of each others and of me and the love and respect you all kept for Dad!

I'll be spending the week-end at Moultsford with a virée in Oxford where I am meeting the President of the Oxford Centre for Hebrew studies, Peter Oppenheimer who is a friend of mine and hopefully visiting Tilly's digs although I believe she may have 'gone down' for the term has ended!
