Dear Mr Waitt, thank you for your email. Being English, I have no sense of humour and, like you, have a terrible memory. Sadly this means that I struggle to remember what Miss Maxwell looks like, let alone anything else about her!

I would love to help you and your family out with the planned trip to the UK. I charge 20 an hour plus any expenses.

I have looked at the hotel that your brother has booked - it is an excellent and exclusive hotel (48 bedrooms/suites, 5 stars, listed in Small Luxury Hotels of the World, right next to Harrods in Knightsbridge). It's restaurant is superb with two Michelin stars (only two restaurants in London have two stars) - however, it has no other facilities i.e. swimming pool, gym, sauna etc, etc, etc - though you can buy a day pass for the Peak Health Club (10) which is less than a ten minute walk away.
