Subject: Winter Weather Update

Dear colleagues,

Harvard University has been closely monitoring the progress of the winter weather event that is expected to arrive early Monday morning and to continue for much of tomorrow. A Winter Storm Warning has been issued for the Boston region, with snowfall expected to begin around 6 am and total accumulations to reach 8 to 12 inches or more over the course of the day. Morning commutes throughout the region will likely be affected.

Although schedules at individual Harvard Schools may vary depending on local conditions, the University and Central Administration currently expect to be open as scheduled Monday. Any individual School with specific schedule alterations will communicate directly with their communities.

As always, the safety of students, faculty and staff is paramount. All Harvard community members are urged to exercise caution as they travel to and from campus Monday.

We understand that travel may be difficult. Those who need to significantly alter their work schedules due to unsafe travel conditions in their local areas or due to other personal circumstances (such as childcare needs) should be in contact with their supervisors.

As always, faculty, students and staff should be guided by their School leadership, with whom they should be in touch with any questions.
