

As founder of The Art of Networking, Dr Marie-Caroline von Weichs an der Glon is currently working as a consultant on topics including networking, relationship building and personal development. Clients consist mostly of CEOs, managing directors, managing or senior partners of companies, politicians and other public figures.
