This from the beta release notes for the next iPhone OS version:

Today's beta introduces new wallpapers and heralds the imminent release of a WiFi calling option for AT&T users.

WiFi calling is the feature where if you're in an area that has poor AT&T signal, but strong wifi, it will seamlessly pass the calls over your wifi connection. Once it's switched on on a device the phone does it invisibly.
