It will =o basic, clinical and social science research as well as scholarly work in=placebo studies. We are situated in all the major teaching hospitals=at Harvard and have already drawn commitments from over 20 faculty. =Anne Harrington will be joining us. We recently published an p=ysiological study of placebo in the New England Journal of Medicine and a =heoretical paper in Philosophic Transactions of the Roy Soc B. (I'm=attaching fyi). We anticipate making some major breakthroughs in ge=etic of placebo effects (we're submitting our findings in the next days) &=bsp;and have major studies in the pipeline.
