Subject: CORRECTING TYPO IN SECOND PARAGRAPH--TROPICAL STORM KATI= CONTINUES TO STRENGTHEN OVER THE EASTERN TROPICAL ATLANTIC

At 5 p.m. today, the center of Tropical Storm Katia was located near 12.7 degrees North, 35.4 degrees West or about 1,990 miles east of St. Croix. Top winds have increased to 60 miles per hour with higher gusts and additional strengthening is forecast. Katia could become a hurricane on Wednesday. The tropical storm is moving along a west-northwesterly track at 20 miles per hour. Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 85 miles from the center.

Since this morning, the National Hurricane Center has adjusted the projected track of Katia more to the south so therefore, on this afternoon's forecast track, the center of Katia will pass closer to the Virgin Islands than earlier projected. The latest estimates suggest that Katia will pass about 344 miles to the northeast of St. John on Sunday afternoon at 5 pm. At that time, Katia will have evolved into a Category Three hurricane with top winds of 120 miles per hour.
