I just heard back on the 45 gallon seagrape bushes. The nursery t=at had them just stepped them up to 65 gallon pots a couple weeks ago. With=that said they also raised their price on them. They are 9-10ft tall and \$5= more expensive.

As another option I have (1,000) 45 gallon sea=rape trees like the ones I attached to this e-mail. These are 13-14ft tall p=anted with 6-7ft of clear trunk. If you planted one of these and two 2= gallon bushes like the one I attached on each side you would have a 14ft tall wall as the 25 gallon are 6ft tall. Let me know if that would work. <=u>

I also have (20-30) 100 gallon seagrape bushes that are 10ft tall by=10ft wide.
