Mr Epstein,

Yes Sir I thought about that. I know we have had issues with PSI and the mix designs of the concrete. I do have experience pouring up to 1400 yards a day (24 hour shift) so I can oversee this directly to make sure its done right. We have a few options here;

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- I will operate the machine (temporarily) until I can train an operator we can trust (its as complex as running a grain combine just need to track weights and do simple math)

- Purchase a product like Vita-Concrete - this has portland cement = sand / agg all mixed in we just break bags and add water and I can calculate how many lbs we need to order before pours

- Vita has premade mix designs up to 5000 psi and if we need more (dont think we will) then we can use additives like fly ash to up the psi
