Good Afternoon Rich,

Jeffers is promising us pricing by tomorrow on the road from gorilla to the sun dial, along with the road from the beach to the flag pole pool. I told him to price up two options for us for each section of road;

Option A: For Heavy traffic
#4 Rebar reinforced 12" /C
4" Thick
PSI - Above 500 - Below 5000 (I want to see what he suggest)
Saw=Cutting to match existing concrete roads

Option B: For Light traffic
6" Mat reinforced
4"=thick
PSI - Above 3500
Saw cuts to match existing concrete roads

He also asked me about when our Carmix truck will be on LSJ and I told him hopefully by the beginning of November. He is planning on using it, however we will have to have our guys operate it and mix the mud. that being said if we are going to be supplying the aggregates in actuality he will only do the formwork and finishing. His price per yard calculations will not apply anymore unless he has his own trucks. We will see what his numbers come back like and I will suggest the best way to proceed with him, it might make more sense to pay him on a price per foot for forming and finishing. Let me know what you think. Thanks!
