In preparation for the framing, I noticed that there will be a niche for the television. Ideally, the tv would be mounted to an articulating arm, so it can be set flush with the wall surface, when not in use. The dimensions of the niche, would be determined by the tv. Were you planning on using the tv that you already have? If so, where is it currently located? If not, did you have a particular model in mind?
