The government has not shown that the executive order provides what due process requires, such as notice and a hearing prior to restricting an individual's ability to travel. ... The procedural protections provided by the Fifth Amendment's due process clause are not limited to citizens. Rather, they "apply to all 'persons' within the United States, including aliens," regardless of "whether their presence here is lawful, unlawful, temporary, or permanent." ... These rights also apply to certain aliens attempting to re-enter the United States after traveling abroad.
