The government has not shown that the executive order =rovides what due process requires, such as notice and a hearing prior =o restricting an individual's ability to travel. ... The =rocedural protections provided by the Fifth Amendment's due =rocess clause are not limited to citizens. Rather, they "appl[y] =o all 'persons' within the United States, including =liens," regardless of "whether their presence here is =awful, unlawful, temporary, or permanent." ... These rights =lso apply to certain aliens attempting to re-enter the United States =fter traveling abroad. [Pages 19-21]
