Here are some images for the design of the shade structures for your pool near the Flag Pole.

- 1) Do you want these to be open trellis and/or solid panels?
- 2) The images you sent us show wood trellises, do you prefer wood?
- 3) Examples show canvas cover, metal covers, retractable covers, any preferences?
- 4) Do you prefer a flat cover or a pitched cover?
- 5) We found trellises constructed out of vinyl, may not be as authentic looking but perhaps durable in this climate.
- 6) The model shows three separate pergolas on either side, would you want more or less? Size?
- 7) Do you want the columns to go into the water? Just as the first two images.

We may not have enough width for this detail with only 21'.
