You missed it at Gadgetoff a few years ago, but we have friends who have made this astonishing system that lets you PROJECT on huge structures "graffiti"... so you can on MASSIVE walls... use a portable projection system they've developed; and then with a laser pen (like the ones we discussed) DRAW on the wall... and the camera attached to the projector attached to some cool software... recreates the light graffiti... and then lets it smear down the wall if you want that, etc.
