We are very glad to welcome you as our guest to the Wiener Opernball.

The “Wiener Opernball” will take place on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of March 2011 at the Wiener Staatsoper.

**The dresscode for ladies is a long evening gown, for gentlemen tails and decorations.**

Guests will arrive at the main entrance of the Staatsoper starting at 9:30 p.m. and walk to their boxes. There is a possibility to “walk the red carpet” on the Feststiege or enter from a side entrance and go directly to your box.

Guests are asked to be seated at 10 p.m. The Ball starts officially with the arrival of the Austrian Head of State, President Heinz Fischer.

After the opening ceremony, which lasts about forty minutes and includes the performance of the Young Ladies’ and Young Gentlemen’s dance committee you have the possibility to use the various dance floors until 5 a.m. Including the main Ball Room there are many different locations in the Opera House where you will be able to dance: altogether there are seven orchestras or entertainers and a disco in the souterrain.

At midnight and at 3 a.m. the quadrille from the operetta “The Bat” by Johann Strauss will be performed at the main Ball Room. All guests are cordially invited to take part in the quadrille, when the traditional dance routine is announced.
